Who can apply: In accordance with park establishment commitments, members of the following First Nation communities may apply (applicants are encouraged to self-identify in their application or may be screened out): Animbiigoo Zaagi'igan - Lake Nipigon; Bingwi Neyaahi Anishinaabek - Sand Point; Biigtigong Nishnaabeg; Fort William First Nation; Michipicoten First Nation; Long Lake #58 First Nation; Biinjitiwaabik Zaaging Anishinaabek - Rocky Bay; Netmizaagamig Nishnaabeg – Pic Mobert First Nation; Pays Plat First Nation; Red Rock Indian Band; Whitesand First Nation; Kiashe Zaaging Anishinaabek - Gull Bay; Namaygoosisagagun First Nation.

About the position: In this job, you will work within the Assets team at Pukaskwa National Park. You will be responsible for inspecting and cleaning employee work areas, public areas, restrooms, and grounds. It will include waste & recycling, litter picking and snow shoveling. The job can be physically demanding, repetitive and requires following, and staying current with health and safety protocols.

To be invited for an interview, applicants must explain how they meet the following requirements:

Education

- Graduation with a secondary school diploma OR
- An acceptable combination of education, training and/or experience

Experience

- Professional cleaning of commercial or institutional facilities
- Working in a team oriented environment

At the interview, candidates will be assessed on these additional criteria:

Abilities

- Plan, organize and carry out work
- Access and use email software

Personal Suitabilities

- Exercises sound judgment
- Communicates effectively
- Personally connects with people
- Takes responsibility; dependable
- Makes things happen, takes initiative



Conditions of employment:

- Obtain & maintain Reliability Security Status
- Complete a pre-employment medical (and periodic medical assessments)
- Willing to work shifts, weekends, holidays, and overtime, if required
- Willing to perform repetitive, strenuous physical activity
- Willing & able to wear a Parks Canada uniform, safety equipment and follow safety procedures
